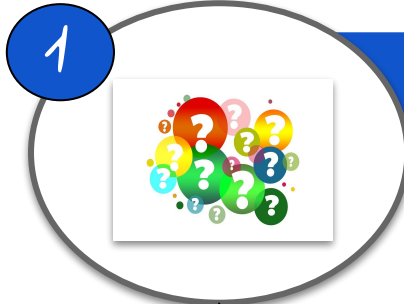


"Heartful" Editing

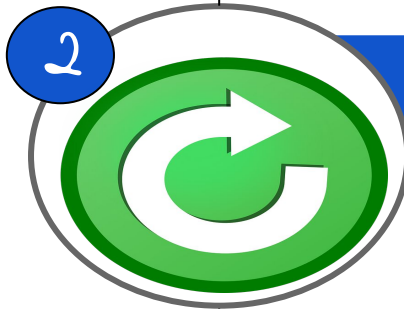
Heartful editing focuses on using positive, heartful language. Try to avoid statements that could make a student feel bad about their writing or start to lose confidence. Instead of telling students what not to do, try to suggest and consider or clarify/ask questions.

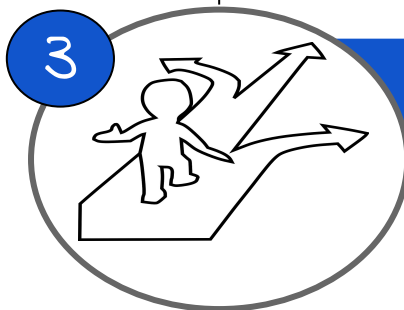
1 "I don't understand what you're trying to say."

Heartful: I'm not what you are trying to say here because this sentence does not seem to fit with the rest of this paragraph. Is it meant to be a transition sentence to your next topic? If so, I suggest using it to start a new paragraph.



2 "This is redundant."

Heartful: I recommend deleting this sentence because the heading effectively explains the purpose of this section.



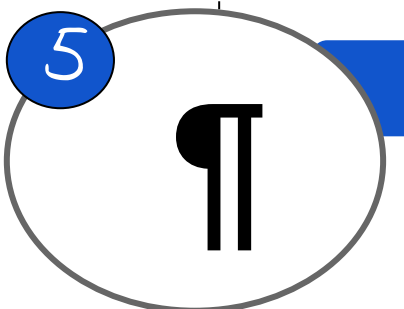
3 "This is confusing."

Heartful: Although you've identified all of the important events, writing about them in chronological order would be more helpful to the reader's understanding of your research process.



4 "Your paper lacks organization."

Heartful: I recommend organizing your paper with headings.



5 "Don't write one-sentence paragraphs."

Heartful: I suggest adding a couple of sentences to this paragraph about In particular, you could mention . . .
